

**NORTHEAST NEIGHBORS AND FRIENDS  
MEETING MINUTES  
NOVEMBER 26, 2018**

The meeting was called to order at 5:34 p.m. by Tania Hunt, Chair. Introductions were made around the table.

Tania presented the East Side Library a check for \$100.00 as a donation.

Doua Lor, Des Moines Police Department, gave his report. He reminded us that November through March is the burglar season. The Treasurer's report was given. The bank balance as of the end of October was \$562.61 in operating expenses and \$2,207.55 of grant money. We have to subtract the \$100.00 to the Library and \$600.00 for web maintenance.

The calendar of our meeting dates in 2019 was discussed. September meeting would be a holiday and October is already booked so we would provably have to change the date and/or location for meeting. Candace offered the use of her church.

Kevin talked about the K-Mart parking lot being barricaded.

GrandView University sent out a survey asking what the public would like to see in the rest of the bowling alley that they own just north of Euclid on East 14<sup>th</sup>. The two suggestions were a gym or a coffee shop but they asked for other ideas.

Paul Sadler made the motion that we ratify by email that we voted to have Linda Westergaard added a a Board member. Second by Kevin Marken. Approved. Connie Boesen talked about the huge group that showed up at the City Council protesting the police profiling and asking that improvements be made. She also stated that the sales tax would be voted on again in March. She explained that Natasha Newcomb has resigned from the school board and applications are being accepted for her replacement. This has to be finalized the latter part of December.

The next meeting will be December 10<sup>th</sup> and we will have the usual coffee and cookies.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:43 p.m.
